No Cold Calling Zones

The No Cold Calling Zone (NCCZ) initiative is a crime prevention initiative. It is supported by Hampshire Trading Standards and Hampshire Constabulary and its aim is to deter unscrupulous cold callers and empower residents to say "No". In Everton, the NCCZ initiative is already in place in Knightcrest Park and has significantly reduced cold calling.

We would like to encourage the spread of the initiative to other parts of Everton. For any road or roads to be considered for the scheme, a Volunteer needs to canvass every home in the proposed zone, using leaflets provided by Trading Standards in a NCCZ Consultation Pack. For the zone to be accepted by Trading Standards, 66% of the households within the proposed area must be in favour. Once accepted, lamppost or wall mounted signage can be erected and residents are provided with stickers for their front doors.

Would anyone interested in volunteering to canvass their local area contact Bob Cockburn, who will then co-ordinate the initial applications and obtain the necessary paperwork.

There is a bus which now goes through Everton daily except Sundays.

The times are as follows:

The Lymington bus leaves The Old Christchurch Road/Everton bus shelter at 9.30, 10.30, 11.30, 12.30 and 1.30 past the hour.

The return journey from Lymington leaves the bus station on the hour from 9.00am until 2.00 pm.

The bus to New Milton leaves the Everton bus shelter/Old Christchurch Road at 9.21, 10.21, 11.21, 12.31, 1.21 and 2.21pm.

The return journey from Whitefield Road, New Milton is again hourly at 9.10 through to 2.10pm.

Local writer Alan Rayment, aka 'Punchy' lives close by to us at Milford on Sea and has just published his first Volume of memoirs...

Isn't it amazing who you bump into in the Everton Village Stores and Post Office, take Alan Rayment for instance. He popped in to post a letter and before you know it, he was telling me all about his latest challenge. With the Newsletter in mind I couldn't help but be interested...

Alan, born in 1928 in London, spent his school years dodging the Blitz and playing cricket at Lord's! He went on to become a Professional Cricketer for Hampshire, plus a Ballroom Dance Teacher and has now settled down to the task of writing and publishing his memoirs.

'Punchy Through The Covers...the early years 1928-1949' is an enjoyable Social History which is interspersed with Alan's own reflections, in so doing he has achieved an excellent thumbnail sketch of British political and social history from 1914 to 1946, and it's all related in a lively and entertaining fashion.

Covering his very early years, Alan has combined reported facts with his imagination to produce a lively account of this personal history and as such this work is clearly going to carry the greatest of interest to his family and friends, and yet not knowing him at all, I found that his memories, (although of a

slightly earlier period than I lived through) allowed me to indulge in some very pleasant nostalgia.

The factual content of the book is enlivened by a selection of beautiful photographs of people and places, from family holidays on the Isle of Wight through those very memorable War years. All well worth looking at!

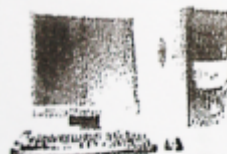
