As a committee we made good progress in 2024.

One of our priorities was to update the Village website, this has been done and we will be able to host all the ECA policies along with minutes from recent meetings. The website looks brighter and is easier to navigate. Our thanks to Nick at TinStar for all the work he did (and continues to do) to support the Everton Village website.

Our focus this year was on smaller village activities rather than one big "Village Rec" event. We had a very successful coffee morning combined with a Litter Pick in March and then in June our 80th D-Day Commemoration events really bought the village together. Thank you to everyone who helped organise and volunteered at these events. And thank you to all the local businesses who donated prizes for raffles. And lastly, thank you to everyone who came along.

Unfortunately, we were unable to have the "Family Olympics" in August. This was mostly due to not being able to get enough interest or support from volunteers to help organise the event, despite repeated requests via Everton Village Voice and posters around the village.

The ECA has been in existence for over 30 years. Whilst it has seen changes in committee members, its purpose remains the same, to provide activities and events that are inclusive and benefit the social welfare of all Everton Residents. However, this will be challenging if we are unable to get support from the village to help organise these events.

#### Full Fibre Broadband Comes to the Parish

At its meeting in April, a representative from Wessex Internet outlined its plans to roll out full fibre broadband to homes and residents in the parish. Wessex has been awarded the Government contract for connecting smaller rural settlements. Wessex is planning to come to Everton in the New Year and will hold public information events as well as leaflet drop everyone to let them know what is planned. We have undertaken substantial maintenance to the zip wire. Unfortunately, this has taken longer than anticipated due to operational issues with the contractor and we apologise for the delay, particularly over the summer months. However, the necessary work will ensure that the zip wire remains an important feature at the rec for many years to come.

#### **Greening Campaign Official Launch**

The Tiptoe, Hordle and Everton Greening Campaign officially launched on 13th July in Hordle Parish Church. We had many very interested members of the public come and find out more; lots of questions were asked and information was shared with people leaving more informed as to how they can do a little bit, or a larger bit, to reduce our carbon footprints.



This Phase 1 launch focused on things that we can all do at home to save

money, reduce carbon emissions, care for our health and help nature. Every household, street, close and lane in Hordle Parish has been invited to 'take action', the details have been delivered on a card. Volunteers have been going round counting-up the cards people have displayed in their windows to show their support. Why not leave your card up for a few months so that you can help promote this important campaign? Together, by encouraging each other along the way, we can make our community and environment more sustainable.

We are also looking to establish community planters in conjunction with the ECA around the pavilion in the autumn. We hope this could become a community gardening area, which will benefit the wellbeing as well as the environment.



Our first event is Abundance – bring along your surplus fruit so it can be re-delivered to local groups and foodbanks. 21st September, 10 – 12 noon in Everton Pavilion. Refreshments will be available

#### **Everton Pavilion**

#### A report by Toby Sears, Chairman of the Pavilion Committee

Everton Pavilion is a resource for our community, available for hire by anyone in or outside of Everton and situated in the heart of the village. It can be reached from Frys Lane where there is a parking area or on foot across the recreation ground via Greenmead Avenue. The Pavilion is a Registered Charity (No 294875) and is managed by a committee of volunteers for the benefit of the village.

It's been fairly quiet at the pavilion although we have been planning our next phase of maintenance and improvements. We have a new class on Wednesdays at 9.30am, sweaty mama, a half hour of exercise for mothers and their kids. You can contact Vicky at newforestsouth.sweatymama.com or 07890095777.

we had our AGM which was sadly very poorly attended. Although we think we have at last found a committee member and a potential treasurer we need a secretary and vice chairman as well as a couple more hirers on the committee. If we can't maintain a committee then the pavilion can't be kept open and sadly volunteers in the community seem to have been declining over the last ten years. Whether it's the ECA, pétanque, club or pavilion we all rely on residents coming forward to help keep them all running as part of a functioning village.

We now have a groundsman tidying up around the pavilion to keep it neat and tidy and the cctv has helped monitor unsocial behaviour and the poo bag dispenser. Please remember the poo bags are not a freebie, they are there for emergencies and if you ever find yourself needing bag perhaps you could then donate one the net time you come to the recreation ground. Please also remember dogs should be kept on lead until you are in the rec, when a dog goes in from the car park off lead you can't see what is round the corner, be it a child who doesn't like dogs or a nervous dog, and you can't see if it poos! we also had an incident with a dog off lead in the car park attacking someone's pet so it really is important.

We have some vacant slots for classes if you are looking for a regular venue, Tuesday morning and afternoon, Wednesday Thursday and Friday afternoons. As well as this we are very good value for family gatherings at the weekend. We are holding an event on the 21st of September to swap fruit from trees around the village. There's always surplus fruit going to waste so every year we try and collect it and then donate it to the WI, food bank and other good causes. This has come about from the greening campaign you may have got involved with, seeking to reduce waste, save energy and promote a sustainable village. I hope next year to have more shrubs in the recreation ground for plants that attract pollinators and also to try and get villagers growing veg and fruit as well as sharing surplus pots, compost, plants and produce, a bit like a gardening club. Look out for notices at the pavilion and on Facebook and get involved. The first event next year will be to show you how to grow, swap plant pots and seeds. There will always be refreshments on hand as well!

Remember the pavilion is available to hire for one off family gatherings and parties too (we've even had a wedding reception!), at £9 an hour with tables, chairs and a fully equipped modern kitchen you will not find better value locally. On top of this we have a refurbished smaller room equipped for alternative and beauty treatments if you are looking for premises or alternatively use for business meetings if you don't have an office, this is just £5 an hour

If you are new to the village the pavilion is in Frys Lane, we are on Facebook, have a website evertonpavilion.org and contact details as well as the timetable are on the noticeboard by the front door

#### Ingredients:

6oz/175g Soft Margarine

6oz/175g Caster Sugar

6oz/175g Self Raising Flour

3 Eggs

1 teaspoon Baking Powder

#### Method:

Place all ingredients in a mixing bowl and beat with a wooden spoon until well mixed (2-3 minutes)

Divide the mixture between two greased and bottom lined 7inch sandwich tins

Bake in the centre of a preheated oven, 170 degrees C or Gas Mark 3 for approximately 25-30 minutes

Turnout and cool on a wire tray

Must be filled with Jam only.

Dust top with Caster Sugar

#### Families & Schools Work at St Mary's

If you've ever passed the Hyundai garage on a weekday morning and seen the youngsters waiting to catch their school bus to Priestlands you will be aware that there are many families living in Everton, perhaps more than you realised. And over the last few months several families with little ones have come to Tea, Toast and Toys on a Wednesday morning thinking that they were the only family in Everton. This is not the case, and we are so glad that through Tea, Toast and Toys, which has now been running for a

year, we are able to provide a place for families to meet up with others and begin to feel a sense of community, where they might have previously felt isolated.

Thanks to a grant from the NFDC, we are now able to offer 'proper' coffee and tea in safety cups as well as cold drinks, toast (thank you to Barry at the Post Office for his kind donations of bread) with toppings, and fruit. On Wednesdays in termtime we offer encouragement and a listening ear for parents and carers, as well as a time of free play, including a craft activity for little ones, followed by story and singing. We want to make this group sustainable for the long term by growing our teams (we are working towards a rota of four teams each doing one week a month in the kitchen doing refreshments, and another team in the hall). We encourage anyone who loves to spend time with younger families to come along on a Wednesday morning and see what we do!





In addition to Family Tea, which has moved to 3pm on the first Sunday of each month, we have also introduced Breakfast Church in St Mary's Hall each second Sunday of the month. The intention is to provide a space where all generations can become community and grow together. Gathering for coffee and brioche at 10.30am we follow this by spending thirty minutes or so with all ages informally exploring a Bible passage together though listening, talking and 'doing'.
